## Prince George's County - Board of Education - Election of Members

FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law relating to the composition of certain school districts in Prince George's County; requiring the members of the Prince George's County Board of Education to be elected from certain school board districts; providing for the boundaries of certain school board districts; requiring candidates to live in certain school board districts and be registered voters; requiring candidates for election to the County Board to include a certain petition containing a certain number of signatures with the candidate's certificate of candidacy; providing for the initial terms of the elected members of the County Board; requiring that a vacancy on the County Board be filled by a certain election if the vacancy occurs within a certain time period; requiring that certain vacancies on the County Board remain vacant under certain circumstances; providing that a member whose term expires may not hold over; requiring certain special elections to take place within a certain number of days under certain provisions of law; requiring the term of the chair and vice chair to be a certain number of years; specifying that the State Open Meetings Act applies to any committee or other entity created by the County Board; requiring the County Board or certain entities of the County Board to take certain actions before and after an executive session; altering the requirements for a quorum of the County Board; requiring the presence of a certain quorum of the County
