A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Prescription Drugs - Canadian Mail Order Plan

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, in coordination with the Secretary of Budget and Management, to develop a 4 5 Canadian mail order plan for the purchase and importation of prescription 6 drugs; requiring the Canadian mail order plan to provide prescription drugs to 7 certain individuals, require a certain contract with a pharmacy benefits 8 manager, incorporate certain patient safety features, include certain cost 9 requirements, and provide certain financial incentives; requiring the Secretary 10 to prepare a certain report for submission to the Legislative Policy Committee on or before a certain date; requiring the Secretary to implement the Canadian 11 12 mail order plan on or before a certain date; and generally relating to a Canadian mail order plan for the purchase and importation of prescription drugs from 13 14 Canada.

WHEREAS, Like many states, Maryland has experienced significant growth in pharmacy costs, and in fiscal year 2007, an increase of 8.5% is anticipated in the State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefit Program, despite steep increases in

- co-payments and the imposition of prior authorization, step therapy, and other cost-saving measures in recent years; and an increase of 6.5% is anticipated in the Maryland Medical Assistance Program; and
- WHEREAS, Growth in prescription drug costs has resulted from escalating enrollment in State assistance programs, increased drug utilization per beneficiary, rising drug costs, and new high—cost drugs replacing less costly drugs; and
- WHEREAS, The State has used various mechanisms, such as tiered co-payments and restricted formularies, to rein in rising prescription drug costs; and
- WHEREAS, Canadian pharmaceutical pricing, distribution practices, and favorable exchange rates can make medications needed by Maryland State employees, Maryland Medical Assistance recipients, and participants in other State pharmacy programs available at far less cost to the State than current policy and practice allows; and
- WHEREAS, Other states, including Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin,
 Oregon, Vermont, North Dakota, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Connecticut,
 Michigan, and Massachusetts, and localities, including Montgomery County,
 Maryland, and Springfield, Massachusetts, are promoting access to Canadian

- WHEREAS, The pharmaceutical manufacturing, storage, distribution, and dispensing requirements under Canadian law are substantially equivalent to United States federal requirements; now, therefore,
