1 (2) A board may subpoena any records or papers pertaining to a 2 licensed business or establishment.

3 (3) If a witness refuses to produce any records or papers so 4 subpoenaed the board shall report the fact to the circuit court for the county, and the 5 court shall proceed by attachment against the witness in all respects as if the refusal 6 had been by a witness summoned to appear in the court in a case pending before it.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 July 1, 2007.
