1 (1) formulate, publish, and distribute the fire laws of Maryland AND 2 OTHER STATE AND FEDERAL STANDARDS, LAWS, GUIDELINES, AND 3 RECOMMENDATIONS;

4 (2) formulate, publish, and distribute an annual report and monthly or 5 other timely bulletins and reports;

- (5) establish and maintain a database on manpower availability and
 training, operational cost, equipment availability, response time, State and local
 financial support, and other relevant factors in providing fire and rescue services;

 VOLUNTEERS AND DISSEMINATING INFORMATION THROUGHOUT THE STATE;

(8) PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES INCLUDING ACCOUNTING,
 AUDITING, AND LEGAL CONSULTATION AND OPERATIONAL COSTS ASSOCIATED
 WITH THE OBJECTIVES ESTABLISHED IN THIS SUBSECTION; AND

(9) PROMOTE, DISSEMINATE, AND ADVOCATE PROGRAMS AND
 SERVICES THAT PERTAIN TO IMPROVING THE SAFETY, HEALTH, AND
 WELLBEING OF FIRE AND RESCUE PERSONNEL THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 July 1, 2007.
