#### A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

## Natural Resources – Yellow Perch – Harvest Restrictions

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from installing, setting, operating, or maintaining in certain tributaries of the Chesapeake Bay at certain times 4 5 certain fishing gear capable of catching yellow perch; establishing a certain 6 exception to the prohibition; establishing a certain exception to the authority of 7 the Department of Natural Resources to regulate a certain fishery resource 8 exclusively through the adoption of a fishery management plan; requiring the 9 Department, in consultation with certain stakeholders, to report annually to the 10 General Assembly on the environmental and economic impact of certain harvest restrictions on or before a certain date; requiring the Department in 11 12 consultation with certain stakeholders, to prepare and submit to certain committees of the General Assembly a certain report related to fisheries on or 13 14 before a certain date; and generally relating to fishery management in the State. 15

1 (2005 Replacement Volume and 2006 Supplement) Preamble 2 3 WHEREAS, There is an immediate need to conserve the dwindling stock of vellow perch in the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries for the purpose of sustaining 4 5 the vellow perch population in the future and ensuring the continued economic 6 viability of the yellow perch commercial fishery; and 7 WHEREAS, Maryland's angling community is concerned about the State's regulatory efforts to manage this coveted fishery because of questionable 8 science–based policies that allow the commercial harvesting of yellow perch: (1) as the 9 10 perch attempt to reach their ancestral spawning grounds; (2) at rates and with nets 11 absent any appropriate limits; and (3) within tributaries previously restocked for vellow perch propagation purposes; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Markets for yellow perch harvested in Maryland are primarily 14 located out of State; and 15 WHEREAS, The commercial harvest of yellow perch comprises 95% of the 16 annual catch in Maryland and, under existing regulatory policies, is therefore the most measurable threat to the future sustainability of the yellow perch fishery; now, 17 therefore. 18 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 21 **Article – Natural Resources** 4 - 215.22 23 Notwithstanding any other provision of this title BUT EXCEPT AS (h) **PROVIDED IN § 4–710(H) OF THIS TITLE**, once a fishery management plan has been 24 adopted by regulation, the State's fishery resources shall be harvested in accordance 25 with the conservation and management measures in the fishery management plan and 26 27 any regulations implementing or amending that plan. 28 4 - 710.29 **(J)** (1) **EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH** (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A PERSON MAY NOT INSTALL, SET, OPERATE, OR MAINTAIN IN A 30 TIDAL OR NONTIDAL TRIBUTARY OF THE CHESAPEAKE BAY FROM JANUARY 1 31

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THROUGH MARCH 20, INCLUSIVE, OF ANY YEAR ANY ENTRAPMENT GEAR,
 ENTANGLEMENT GEAR, OR NET CAPABLE OF CATCHING YELLOW PERCH.

3 (2) A PERSON MAY USE THE FOLLOWING FISHING GEAR FOR
4 HARVESTING BAIT IN THE TIDAL AND NONTIDAL TRIBUTARIES OF THE
5 CHESAPEAKE BAY FROM JANUARY 1 THROUGH MARCH 20, INCLUSIVE, OF ANY
6 YEAR:

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(I) **A HAND OPERATED DIP NET;** 

(II) A CAST OR THROW NET;

9 (III) A MINNOW TRAP THAT HAS A MAXIMUM OPENING 10 DIAMETER OF 1 INCH;

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- (IV) A MINNOW SEINE; OR
- 12(v)AN EEL POT THAT HAS A MAXIMUM OPENING DIAMETER13OF 1.5 INCHES.

THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH INTERESTED 14 (3) STAKEHOLDERS, SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN ACCORDANCE 15 WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE ON OR BEFORE 16 DECEMBER 31, 2008, AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER ON THE ENVIRONMENTAL 17 18 AND ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THE HARVEST RESTRICTIONS FOR YELLOW PERCH 19 UNDER THIS SECTION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING THE CONDITIONS OR CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH THE YELLOW PERCH RESTRICTIONS MAY BE 20 21 **REPEALED.** 

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of 23 Natural Resources, in consultation with interested stakeholders, shall:

24 (1) analyze and develop findings regarding new funding mechanisms25 to help:

(i) underwrite the cost to the Department of researching,
 developing, managing, and enforcing the fishery policies of the State; and

(ii) promote the economic interests of the State's commercial
 fishing industry; and

1 (2) report the findings, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 2 Government Article, to the House Environmental Matters Committee and the Senate 3 Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee on or before November 1, 4 2007.

5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 June 1, 2007.
