## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning 1 2 Election Law - County Offices or Baltimore City Municipal Offices - Election 3 FOR the purpose of altering the date of the primary elections in Baltimore City; 4 5 requiring that any county, including Baltimore City, hold general elections for county offices or Baltimore City municipal offices on certain dates; providing for 6 7 the terms of office for certain municipal officers; providing for a delayed effective 8 date; and generally relating to election dates for county offices or Baltimore City 9 municipal offices. 10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - Election Law 11 Section 8-201 and 8-301 12 13 Annotated Code of Maryland (2003 Volume and 2006 Supplement) 14 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 16 **Article - Election Law** 17

19 (a) (1) There shall be a statewide primary election in every 20 even–numbered year.

6 7 8	(b) In Baltimore City, there shall be a primary election for municipal offices on the second Tuesday following the first Monday in September in the year [following the election of] the Governor <b>IS ELECTED</b> .

14 15 16 17 18	(b) [In Baltimore City, there shall be a general election for municipal offices on the Tuesday following the first Monday in November in the year following the election of the Governor] IN ANY COUNTY, INCLUDING BALTIMORE CITY, THERE SHALL BE A GENERAL ELECTION FOR COUNTY OFFICES AND BALTIMORE CITY MUNICIPAL OFFICES ON THE TUESDAY FOLLOWING THE FIRST MONDAY IN NOVEMBER IN THE YEAR IN WHICH THE GOVERNOR IS ELECTED.
20 21 22 23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the term of office for municipal officers elected in Baltimore City in the general election in November 2007 is 3 years. Beginning in November 2010, the term of office for municipal officers elected in Baltimore City in the general election is 4 years.
