3 FOR the purpose of reestablishing the Joint Committee on Unemployment Insurance Oversight; establishing the membership and staffing of the Committee; 4 5 requiring the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates 6 to designate the cochairs of the Committee; requiring the Committee to examine 7 certain issues; authorizing the Committee to examine certain issues; requiring 8 the Committee to issue a certain report by a certain date; prohibiting a member 9 of the Committee from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing a member of the Committee to receive certain reimbursements; providing for the 10 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the reestablishment of the 11 Joint Committee on Unemployment Insurance Oversight. 12

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 1 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article – State Government** 3 2-10A-11. 4 THERE IS A JOINT COMMITTEE ON UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (A) 5 6 **OVERSIGHT.** 7 **(B)** THE COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING 15 MEMBERS: 8 (1) THREE MEMBERS OF THE SENATE, APPOINTED BY THE 9 **PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;** THREE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED 10 **(2)** BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES; 11 12 (3) THE SECRETARY OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION, **OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;** 13 14 (4) SECRETARY **ECONOMIC** THE OF BUSINESS AND 15 **DEVELOPMENT, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;** 16 A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND (5) RETAILERS ASSOCIATION, DESIGNATED BY THE MARYLAND RETAILERS ASSOCIATION; 17 (6) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND CHAMBER OF 18 19 **COMMERCE, DESIGNATED BY THE MARYLAND CHAMBER OF COMMERCE;** 20 A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE NATIONAL FEDERATION OF (7) 21 INDEPENDENT BUSINESS, DESIGNATED BY THE NATIONAL FEDERATION OF **INDEPENDENT BUSINESS;** 22 23 (8) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE JOB OPPORTUNITIES TASK FORCE, DESIGNATED BY THE JOB OPPORTUNITIES TASK FORCE; 24 TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF UNION LABOR, DESIGNATED BY 25 (9) THE MARYLAND STATE AND DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA AFL-CIO: AND 26

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(10) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ACADEMIC PROFESSION WHO IS
KNOWLEDGEABLE IN UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE LAW, DESIGNATED JOINTLY
BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
DELEGATES.

5 (C) THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF 6 THE PRESIDING OFFICER WHO APPOINTED THEM.

7 (D) THE PRESIDENT AND THE SPEAKER SHALL APPOINT A SENATOR 8 AND A DELEGATE, RESPECTIVELY, EACH TO SERVE AS COCHAIR.

9 (E) (1) THE COMMITTEE SHALL EXAMINE THE CONDITION OF THE 10 UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE SYSTEM IN THE STATE AS A RESULT OF THE 11 IMPLEMENTATION OF CHAPTER 169 OF THE ACTS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY 12 OF 2005.

13 (2) THE COMMITTEE MAY EXAMINE THE NEED FOR ADDITIONAL 14 ALTERATIONS TO THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE SYSTEM, INCLUDING THE 15 CHARGING AND TAXATION PROVISIONS AND THE ELIGIBILITY AND BENEFIT 16 PROVISIONS, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE FAIRNESS OF THE SYSTEM AND IN 17 ORDER TO MAINTAIN THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE TRUST FUND AT A 18 LEVEL SUFFICIENT TO ENSURE THAT BENEFITS WILL BE PAID FROM THE FUND.

19(F)(1)THEDEPARTMENTOFLEGISLATIVESERVICESSHALL20PROVIDE STAFFING FOR THE COMMITTEE.

(2) THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION
SHALL REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE ON THE CONDITION OF UNEMPLOYMENT
INSURANCE IN THE STATE.

(G) A MEMBER OF THE COMMITTEE MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION
FOR SERVING ON THE COMMITTEE, BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR
EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED
IN THE STATE BUDGET.

(H) THE COMMITTEE SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND
RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF THE
STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON DECEMBER 31 OF
EACH YEAR.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 June 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and 7 months and, at the 3 end of December 31, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly,

4 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
