1	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, [after December 1,
2	1985,] a person may not use, sell, manufacture, or distribute for use or sale within the
3	State any cleaning agent that contains more than 0.0 percent phosphorus by weight
4	expressed as elemental phosphorus except for an amount not exceeding 0.5 percent
5	phosphorus that is incidental to manufacturing.

- (b) [After December 1, 1985] **EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION**, a person may use, sell, manufacture, or distribute for use or sale a cleaning agent that contains greater than 0.0 percent phosphorus by weight, but does not exceed 8.7 percent phosphorus by weight that is:
- 10 (1) A detergent used in a dishwashing machine, whether commercial 11 or household; or
- 12 (2) A substance the Secretary, by rule and regulation, excludes from 13 the 0.0 percent phosphorus limitation of subsection (a) of this section based on a 14 finding that compliance with this section would:
  - (i) Create a significant hardship on the user; or

- 16 (ii) Be unreasonable because of the lack of an adequate substitute cleaning agent.
- 18 (C) AFTER DECEMBER 1, 2008 JULY 1, 2009 JANUARY 1, 2010, A
  19 PERSON MAY NOT USE, SELL, MANUFACTURE, OR DISTRIBUTE FOR USE OR SALE
  20 WITHIN THE STATE ANY DETERGENT USE FOR USE IN A HOUSEHOLD
  21 DISHWASHING MACHINE, WHETHER COMMERCIAL OR HOUSEHOLD, THAT
  22 CONTAINS MORE THAN 0.5 PERCENT PHOSPHORUS BY WEIGHT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, by December 1, 2008, the Maryland Department of the Environment shall report to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on:
- 26 (1) the prospective availability of detergents containing 0.5 percent 27 phosphorus or less, by weight, for use in commercial dishwashing machines; and
- 28 (2) a recommended date by which the use of such detergents in commercial dishwashing machines may be reasonably required.
- SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
