Milk Products - Farmstead Cheese Production - Pilot Study

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a milk processor – farmstead cheese producer permit; 4 authorizing the holder of a milk processor – farmstead cheese producer permit 5 to perform certain functions and to produce farmstead cheese; requiring the 6 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to issue only a certain number of 7 milk processor – farmstead cheese producer permits; establishing certain 8 qualifications for a certain milk processor – farmstead cheese producer permit; 9 providing for the expiration date of a milk processor - farmstead cheese 10 producer permit; exempting the sale of farmstead cheese from a certain prohibition on the sale of raw milk; defining a certain term; providing for the 11 termination of this Act; and generally relating to a pilot study for the production 12 of farmstead cheese. 13



It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of September 30, 2012, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
