3 FOR the purpose of establishing that, if a person is convicted of failing to yield the right-of-way in violation of certain provisions of law and the violation 4 contributes to an accident that results in serious bodily injury to another, the 5 6 person is subject to a certain fine and the Motor Vehicle Administration is required to suspend the person's license for a certain period of time; 7 8 establishing the fine and period of license suspension to which a person is 9 subject if the person is convicted of failing to yield the right-of-way in violation of certain provisions of law and the violation contributes to an accident that 10 results in the death of another; providing that the penalties established under 11 this Act are in addition to other penalties provided by law; providing that a 12 certain licensee may request a certain hearing; and generally relating to 13 14 penalties for failure to yield the right-of-way.
