1 [(i)] (1) Selecting, administering, scoring, and interpreting 2 instruments designed to assess an individual's aptitudes, attitudes, abilities, 3 achievements, interests, and personal characteristics; and

4 [(ii)] (2) Using nonstandardized methods and techniques for 5 understanding human behavior in relation to coping with, adapting to, or changing life 6 situations.

7 [(2) "Appraisal" does not include instruments which require specialized 8 psychological training for administration and interpretation unless the licensed or 9 certified professional counselor has completed training deemed by the Board of 10 Examiners of Psychologists and the State Board of Professional Counselors and 11 Therapists to be equivalent to that of a licensed psychologist who is qualified to 12 administer the same types of instruments.]

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect14 October 1, 2007.
