A BILL ENTITLED AN ACT concerning 1 Public Safety Employees Killed in the Performance of Duties - Helicopter 2 3 Pilots and Aviation Maintenance Technicians - Death Benefits 4 FOR the purpose of defining the term "rescue squad member" as it relates to eligibility 5 for certain death benefits and funeral expenses so as to include certain helicopter pilots and aviation maintenance technicians; and generally relating 6 7 to death benefits for public safety employees killed in the performance of duties. 8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 9 Article – Public Safety Section 1–202 10 Annotated Code of Maryland 11 (2003 Volume and 2006 Supplement) 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Public Safety** 15 1-202.16 17 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. 18 (2)(i) "Child" means a natural or adopted, legitimate or illegitimate child or stepchild of the decedent. 19

 - (h) Payments under this section shall be made out of money that the Governor includes for that purpose in the State budget.
 - (i) A person aggrieved by a final decision of the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services under this section may seek judicial review as provided for review of final decisions in Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the State Government Article.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
