10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)								
Catholic Charities traces its beginnings to 1792. Today the non-profit social services agency - the								
largest in Maryland - exemplifies the mandate to "serve the least of these". Over 160,000 people in all walks of life - children and families, the disadvantaged, seniors and people living with disabilities - regardless of their religious beliefs, age or race - benefit from Catholic Charities' services. Catholic Charities is a widely admired, cutting edge organization, with an enviable record of spending 90 cents of every revenue dollar on direct services. Every day the 2,100 employees and								
10,000 volunteers strive to ensure dignity and encourage hope for people in 10 Maryland								

jurisdictions.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

At the Hispanic Apostolate we serve people from more than 120 countries. To improve the health of people in the immigrant community and to reduce the use of emergency rooms, medical institutions - including St. Joseph Medical Center, Johns Hopkins Hospital, University of MD School of Dentistry and the Wilmer Eye Clinic - have developed a unique collarboration with Catholic Charities to more than double the provision of current health services - such as vision and dental services, primary care, pediatric inoculations so children can remain healthy and attend school, screenings for cancer, TB and other diseases, flu shots and mental health counseling. To accomplish this, it is necessary to redesign and renovate the 43 year old building. Currently a health van with 2 exam rooms comes to the facility 2 days a week. With capital improvements there will be 4 exam rooms in use 5 days a week, 2 dental chair stations, 2 consulting rooms for mental health counseling and enrolling people in M-CHIP and Medicaid, space for medical records, specimen processing, storage for equipment such as oxygen and nebulizers and a medication room.Upgraded electrical and HVAC systems will support the medcial equipment and services. In addition, Catholic Charities has and will continue to engage in health research projects with institutions of higher learning - most recently Morgan State University - and will support the provision of the hospitals' health outreach and services by providing management and clerical support for the programs.
