10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)								
The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission is a bi-county agency, empowered								
by the State of Maryland in1927 to acquire, develop, maintain and administer a regional system of								
parks in Prince George's and Montgomery Counties. The M-NCPPC is also empowered to prepare								
and administer a General Plan for the physical development of most of the bi-county area and								

operate the public recreation program in Prince George's County.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The College Park Aviation Museum opened in 1998 to showcase the remarkable history of the world's oldest continuously operating airport, which was founded in 1909 by the Wright Brothers who came to teach the first military aviators to fly. The museum has been very successful since its opening in 1998, and in fact, there is now a need to construct additional space to house its expanding programs. It is our goal to have Phase 2 of the project (construction of Airport Operations Facility) underway by 2009 to celebrate and commemorate the 100th Anniversary of Aviation in Maryland and the centennial of the world's first operating airfield.

An analysis of the site identified the area to the northwest of the museum, adjacent to the airport operations facility, as the best location for a museum expansion. Airport operations and management are currently housed in two prefabricated structures that do not project an image of permanence and longevity appropriate for this historic site.

The proposed design concept unifies the needs of the airport operations facility and museum into a single structure that will establish a strong, new identity for both.

The design concept includes the following features:

- A new parking area and entrance for all airport and museum visitors
- A linear concourse linking the two parts of the complex with views of the parked aircraft and runways
- A two-story atrium above the expanded museum reception and gift shop areas with space for an aircraft to be suspended
- A linear gallery above the concourse suitable for art or photographic exhibits
- Additional exhibit space at the mezzanine level that could house temporary or touring exhibits
- A sloped floor auditorium accommodating approximately 200 people
- A multipurpose room with an outdoor terrace that can be used for meetings, catered events in association with the auditorium, or as a classroom for school groups

These features of the museum combined with the proposed 2,000 sq. ft. airport operations facility will create a new iconic structure that will dramatically enhance the visibility of the museum and the identity of this historic airfield.

This project will be divided into 3 phases.

Phase 1 relates to the design of the entire project (airport operations facility and museum expansion) and the estimated design cost is \$1,000,000. The current bond bill request for \$250,000 will be combined with M-NCPPC funding and private contributions to fund the design phase. The construction cost for the entire project is \$15 million (airport operations wing - \$1 million and museum expansion - \$14 million).

Phase 2 of the project deals with the construction of the Airport Operations Facility utilizing monies from a projected \$950,000 grant from the Federal Aviation Administration as well as small matches from the State and M-NCPPC.

Phase 3 of the project deals with the construction of the museum expansion estimated to cost \$14 million. Proposed funding for this phase will be from private contributions via a Capital Campaign that will begin in 2007 as well as projected additional funds from the State and the M-NCPPC.
