## 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The mission of the College Park Boys and Girls Club is to provide a safe and nurturing environment for the children of College Park. Sports programs are designed to promote high standards in physical fitness, mental alertness and social living. Our aim is to teach all youth members between the ages of 5 to 16, regardless of race or religion, to understand and practice the principles of sportsmanship, fair play and good citizenship. The children learn trust, respect for their peers and adults, the value of teamwork through responsibility and dependability. They also develop athletic skills that provide physical fitness and open the door for future athletic accomplishments. Our programs afford younger children the opportunity to participate in organized athletics in Prince George's County where public school athletics do not start prior to high school. Through focused efforts that promote equality, increased human independence, self-sufficiency and dignity we give back to our community. Fulfilling these objectives promises a better future for our community and for our country. The College Park Boys and Girls Club offer the following activities:

- Baseball/T-Ball/Softball April 1st through July 15th Season Practices are usually two times weekly, each practice lasting 1 to 2 hours, games are played Monday through Saturday.
- Basketball December 1st through February 28th Practices are usually two times weekly, each practice lasting 1 to 2 hours; games are played Monday through Saturday evening depending on the schedule.
- Bowling September 1st through March 30th Practices are every Saturday, lasting 1 to 2 hours until league play starts, thereafter every Saturday a match is held.
- · Cheerleading August 1st through November 15th Practices are usually two times weekly, each practice lasting 2 hours; Cheerleaders cheer at Friday & Saturday Football games and compete in a least one competition a year.
- · Football August 1st through November 15th Practices are three times weekly, each practice runs 2 hours with games on Saturday
- Spring/Fall Soccer March 1st through April 15th / August 1st through November 15th Practices are usually two times weekly, each practice running 1 to 1 ½ hours, with games on Saturday. Soccer is available to children age 5 through 18.

#### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The City of College Park has developed a Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project at Duvall Field that provides for a comprehensive renovation of this multi-use recreational facility to address deferred maintenance, field rejuvenation, perimeter walking trail with fitness stations, lighting, fencing, restroom facilities, equipment storage, spectator seating, parking, access issues, and other amenities. The total project cost is \$1,760,000.

An element of this CIP project is the construction of a concession area to include a concession building, equipment storage areas, office space, public restrooms, picnic areas, and street furniture. The College Park Boys and Girls Club is the main user of the current concession area, which is in great need of repair and upgrade. Currently the College Park Boys and Girls Club has no office space, so new offices in the new concession area will be a great improvement to their organization. Additionally, the College Park Boys and Girls Club uses the concession stand as its main source of fundraising. Improvements to the concession area will enable the Club to increase its fundraising efforts and thus provide more programs as well as enhance current programs.
