## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The Barbara Ingram School for the Arts is designed as a four-year high school, serving grades 9th to 12th. The School for the Arts is intended to provide students with intensive, pre-professional training in the arts within the context of a comprehensive, college preparatory academic curriculum. The school would provide qualified students with intensive training in one of the four arts disciplines: the visual arts, music, theatre, or dance. There will be departments established for all of these disciplines. The draw of students for this school is anticipated to come primarily from Washington County, but also reach out to the regional area. The academic program for these students will be provided in a separate facility but located within the downtown Hagerstown area.

The program for this school will serve initially 150 students, with possible program expansion to 300 in the future. The Program will have the following break-down of students; 40% in Music (choral and instrumental), 20% in Theatre, 20% in Dance, and 20% in Visual Arts. The building design will build in some flexibility so that any future program changes will be allowable. The Board also envisions the School to serve as an arts resource for Washington County by offering performances, educational workshops, and extensive after-school training in the arts to Washington County children. The Board of Education anticipates partnering with neighboring cultural institutions to take advantage of existing nearby facilities.

- Family Performance Series
- Individual Private Instruction at the facilities for outside persons.
- Workshops for WCPS elementary and middle students.

### **FACILTIES**

The Barbara Ingram School for the Arts project is designed to meet the growing needs of the County School population by providing a greater diversity of choices in the learning environment.

New Facilities will accommodate the program by devoting one floor of the building for each instructional subject.

### Black Box Theatre

Keyboard Room used for Music Technology, Composition, Music Theory, Performance and Wave Editing.

Choral/ Music Room on an entire floor with practice rooms

Dance Room with associated/changing rooms

Visual Arts Floor will include a computer lab for photo and graphics students.

Sculpture will also be included in the visual arts area with ceramics that have a kiln and sink area. Small lounge area in the front part of the building.

Several individual offices on each floor along with a central receiving area in the front lobby.
