10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Founded in 1987 as Rockville Arts Place, Metropolitan Center for the Visual Arts, (herein referred to as VisArts) is a not-for-profit visual art center, and recently celebrated over eighteen years of service to Montgomery County and the Washington Metropolitan area. VisArts has built steady growth on solid programs that satisfy our community's need for gallery exhibitions, school and diverse community, outreach art programs for all levels of abilities, and opportunities for hands-on arts training. In its mission the Metropolitan Center for the Visual Arts develops passion for the visual arts, fosters creative activity, and expands artistic knowledge through exemplary education, exhibition, and community outreach programs serving children and adults.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

After nearly two decades in downtown Rockville, VisArts' space was demolished to make way for the redevelopment of the new Town Center in Rockville Maryland. The City of Rockville is currently in the middle of a \$350 million redevelopment of downtown Rockville. The New Town Center in downtown Rockville includes a mix of retail, restaurant, entertainment, residential, office uses, and a visual arts center.

VisArts needs to raise \$3.3 million for the design, construction and fit- out and the interior space of its 27,000 square foot new art center in Rockville. The capital campaign that began in March of 2005 has raised nearly \$1.8 million to date. These funds have been and continue to be raised from 1) the public sector 2) the private sector 3) the business sector and 4) the foundation sector.
