House Bill 572 (Del Health and Government Operations

Finance

Health Insurance - Personal Responsibility - Study

This bill requires the Maryland Health Care Commission (MHCC), in consultation with other specified agencies, to study the issue of personal responsibility for obtaining health care coverage.

The study must address \bullet the affordability of health insurance; \bullet the need to subsidize health insurance for certain individuals; \bullet the use of incentives to encourage individuals to purchase health insurance; \bullet strategies to educate individuals and employers about the importance of health coverage; \bullet whether individual responsibility should be accompanied by some form of employer responsibility; \bullet enforcement issues; \bullet potential reductions in uncompensated care and government expenditures from personal responsibility provisions; and \bullet the need for religious exemptions from any proposed coverage requirement. A report with findings and recommendations is due by December 1, 2007.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2007.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: MHCC special fund revenues and expenditures would increase by \$50,000 in FY 2008 to complete the study required under the bill.

Analysis

Current Law: None applicable.

Background: As of July 1, 2007, Massachusetts residents must purchase health insurance when an acceptably comprehensive plan is available at an affordable price or face a financial penalty (\$189 in 2007 and half the cost of the lowest available yearly premium in 2008). In January 2007, California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger proposed a health care reform plan that would require all California residents to obtain health insurance or face reductions in their state income tax refunds or have their wages garnished.

State Fiscal Effect: Special fund expenditures for MHCC would increase by \$50,000 in fiscal 2008 to hire a contractor to assist in the collection and analysis of the data required for the study. Special fund revenues are expected to closely match expenditures to cover ongoing MHCC operations
