10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)								
The Allegany County Public Schools Foundation, Inc. was formed to support and ensure the								
educational experience and enhance the educational opportunities for all public school students by								
providing resources to support a creative teaching atmosphere within the public school system. The								
foundation will accomplish its goals by applying for grants which will fund educational programs,								
fund employee training, purchase school buildings and equipment, provide sub-grant funding to								
-	gifted teachers to develop unique teaching methods and programs, and create avenues for alumni to							
become involved and support the foundation goals.								

11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The Allegany County Public Schools Foundation, Inc. is a 501c3 corporation conducting a \$7 million capital campaign to renovate Greenway Avenue Stadium located in Cumberland, Maryland. Greenway Avenue Stadium serves as the primary athletic facility for both Allegany and Fort Hill high schools and each year attracts thousands of spectators attending student athletic events from the tri-state area and throughout Maryland.

Greenway Avenue Stadium was constructed in the 1930's by the Public Works Administration (PWA) as part of President Roosevelt's New Deal. The stadium cost approximately \$85,000 to build with \$59,000 contributed by the PWA and \$25,000 by the Board of Education. The original 6,000 seat Fort Hill Stadium, which is considered an historic landmark in the community, was built on the campus of Fort Hill High School which was also built by the PWA.

In 1984 the Board of Education of Allegany County renamed Fort Hill Stadium to Greenway Avenue Stadium in recognition of the shared status of the facility. The stadium was upgraded to an all weather playing surface in 1998 in anticipation of hosting scrimmages by the Washington Redskins who held summer training camp at Frostburg State University.

Seventy years after construction, the facility is in need of major renovation and replacement. Cosmetic enhancements were completed at the stadium in 1996 with the cooperation of the community by collecting \$1 ticket surcharge on adult ticket prices for varsity football, varsity soccer, and varsity track events at the facility. This stadium fund has paid for numerous minor maintenance projects and facility improvements.

In response to deteriorating conditions at the stadium, the Board of Education recently conducted a feasibility study to assess structural issues at the facility. The study concluded that the entire facility must be addressed if it is to continue serving as a venue for high school athletics and community events. The study recommended renovation of home stands with handicapped accessibility, team locker rooms, concession areas, press box, visitor's stands, ticket booths, flag pole/scoreboard area, and turf replacement.

The condition of the stadium was shared with the public during the November 2006 Board of Education public meeting. Completion of the total project at a cost of \$7.0 million has been designed in phases so components of the stadium most in need of replacement can be addressed in a timely manner to ensure continued utilization of the facility.

A primary goal of the Allegany County Public Schools Foundation, Inc. is to support programs in the Allegany County Public Schools. Since the foundation accepts grants and private donations, the Greenway Avenue Stadium capital campaign will cease when the project is complete, but the foundation will continue to serve Allegany County students and stakeholders with other initiatives.
