### 6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt to serve as a grant to the County Executive and County Council of Howard County for the planning, construction, capital equipping, and design of a recreational park at Blandair Regional Park.

### 7. Matching Fund Requirements

The grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act.

#### 8. Special Provisions

The grantee shall grant and convey to the Maryland Historical Trust a perpetual preservation easement to the extent of its interest.

### 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Howard County, Maryland is the Grantee organization. The Department of Recreation and Parks manages over 8000 acres of land and 49 developed recreation areas in Howard County. The Department, in consort with the Howard County Department of Public Works will secure an architectural and engineering firm to design the park based on the Blandair Master Plan. Park construction will begin in fiscal year 2010 upon completion of the design effort. The quality of the county's facilities and programs is a testament to the County's ability to manage and operate this proposed regional park.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The design and construction of this 300-acre park will be in accordance with the approved Blandair Regional Park Master Plan. The Master Plan includes a nature center, pathways and walking trails, court games, athletic fields, picnic facilities, an indoor sports hall, a children's garden, playgrounds, a maintenance facility, roads and parking. The master plan for this park was developed by the 23-member Blandair Planning Committee in 2003. The Master Plan was presented at three public meetings to receive comments and then approved by the Planning Committee.

Howard County is requesting a \$500,000 Bond Bill Grant for planning, design, site preparation, construction, and capital equipping of the 300-acre Blandair Regional Park on Maryland Route 175 in Columbia. This 300-acre park was purchased with County funds and State Program Open Space funds, thereby assuring its permanent use for recreation and preservation purposes. This project will include passive and active recreation facilities, while preserving over 200 acres of forest, wetlands and historic areas with the 300-acre park.

A master plan for this park was developed by the twenty-three member Blandair Planning Committee in 2003. The Master Plan was presented at three public meetings and then adopted by the Committee. The Master Plan includes a nature center, pathways and walking trails, court games, athletic fields, picnic facilities, an indoor sports center, a children's garden, playgrounds, maintenance facility, roads and parking. The Blandair Mansion and outbuildings are protected under a 28-acre easement granted to the Maryland Historical Trust. The National Park Service is currently restoring the Mansion with local and state funding.

A Regional Park of this magnitude will draw visitors from throughout the County as well as adjacent jurisdictions. The County population to be served is currently in excess of 270,000 people. This facility can host large festivals and athletic tournaments and will greatly benefit the local economy, particularly restaurants, hotels, sporting goods stores and small markets. This park is in the Planned Service Area (Smart Growth Area) of Howard County and will help reduce the current over-usage of Centennial Park. This project is identified in the 2005 Land Preservation, Recreation and Parks Plan as a "short range" need, and it will help address current shortages of athletic fields, court games, playgrounds, and pathways in the Ellicott City, Elkridge, North Laurel and Columbia Planning Areas.

It should be noted that the County received a \$500,000 Bond Bill in 2004 and a \$300,000 Bond Bill in 2005 for the restoration of the Blandair Mansion. The \$2 million restoration is currently in progress utilizing the U. S. Department of Interior, National Park Service, Historic Preservation Training Center (HPTC) as the restoration contractor. The exterior restoration will be complete this summer and then, HPTC will begin the interior restoration. Completion is scheduled for the Fall of 2008.

In fiscal year 2007 the Howard County Council approved \$744,000 to design this park, therefore the local match requirement of this Bond Bill is already satisfied. The County has initiated a "Quality Based Selection" process to evaluate and interview prospective design consultants. This bond bill will allow the County to proceed with park design.
