10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

To complete the renovation and rehabilitation project initially commenced in 1999 intended to prevent structures in the Park from continued deterioriation. Montgomery County, the State, and the federal government have contributed to that effort. To date, approximately \$21,287,000 has been appropriated from all sources, including private donations. The funding request will cover costs associated with the final phase (Phase V) of the project: the Chautauqua Tower, Crystal Pool Façade Remnants and First Aid Building, which are listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and several smaller buildings and structures. The project will ensure the preservation of historic resources and will increase the space that can be used for classroom, studio, or gallery purposes. An unsafe retaining wall will be stabilized. The National Park Service estimates that at least 500,000 individuals visit the Park annually.

28. Comments: (3000 characters maximum)

The final phase of construction (Phase V) envisions Montgomery County, the State, and the federal government each contributing \$700,000. In 2006, Montgomery County appropriated \$700,000 and the State appropriated \$475,000. The U.S. Senate Appropriations Committee included \$700,000 in the Interior Department appropriations bill for FFY 2007. However, the last Congress did not take action on this appropriations bill. Efforts are continuing to secure the federal share with the current Congress and the National Park Service. The \$225,000 bond bill request reflects the balance of the hoped for State contribution. Prior construction includes the Spanish Ballroom, Carousel building, Yellow Barn, and North and South Arcade Buildings. Construction is managed by Montgomery County with oversight by a steering committee consisting of the County, State, and the National Park Service. Most Park operations are managed by the Glen Echo Park Partnership for Arts and Culture Inc. The Park offers a variety of arts and environmental education classes and activities as well as social dance and children's theater (Adventure Theater and The Puppet Company).
