6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State Debt to serve as a grant to the Board of Directors of Way Station, Inc. for the design, renovation, and capital equipping of Way Station, a facility to provide services to individuals with mental illness or developmental disabilities, located in Frederick.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

The grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of in kind contributions. The fund may consist of real property or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act.

10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Founded in 1978 and headquartered in Frederick, Way Station provides comprehensive, community-based treatment, rehabilitation, housing, employment and other support services for over 7,000 children and adults with mental illness or developmental disabilities through locations in Frederick, Washington, Howard and Carroll Counties and Baltimore City. In addition, Way Station also provides employment support services to over 500 homeless veterans throughout the state, many of whom have no disability at all.

Way Station's adult programs include: supported employment, psychiatric rehabilitation; day habilitation; residential rehabilitation; supportive housing, mobile treatment, mobile crisis, residential crisis, outpatient mental health clinic, and veterans support. Way Station's children services include: in-home family preservation services for children at-risk of out-of-home placement; in-home multi-systemic therapy for children involved with the juvenile justice system; facility-based respite for children with emotional or behavioral difficulties; housing for transitionage youth with mental illness; and wraparound case management for children at-risk of out-of-home placement.

Way Station is nationally accredited by the Commission of Accreditation for Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) and licensed by Maryland Mental Hygiene Administration, Maryland Department of Human Resources, Maryland Department of Rehabilitation Services, and Maryland Department of Developmental Disabilities. Way Station's statewide reputation in adult services was recently reaffirmed when the Mental Hygiene Administration and the University of Maryland contracted with Way Station to train other providers in the state regarding Supported Employment. On a national level, CARF recently recognized Way Station's Facility-based Respite Program for Children and Way Station's Mobile Treatment Program as national model programs. In addition, Way Station was one of three non-profits in the country to be selected by the U.S. Department of Labor to administer a multi-year national demonstration project piloting innovative strategies in supported employment. Over the course of its 27-year history, Way Station has been recognized by the National Institute for Mental Health and National Alliance on Mental Illness as a national model program. In addition, Way Station's National Education Center has provided: technical assistance, including web-based training, to over 2,000 agencies and individuals; fieldwork education to 1,000 mental health professionals through affiliations with 100 colleges and universities; and consultation to over 200 government and private healthcare agencies from eight countries, including a major partnership with the George Washington University Center for Health Services Research and Policy regarding the promotion of work incentives for individuals with disabilities.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The purpose of the project is to renovate two adjacent buildings Way Station owns in the City of Frederick in order to allow the organization to expand the following programs: 1) employment services funded by the U.S. Department of Labor for veterans with disabilities and homeless veterans without disabilities; 2) in-home intervention services for children and adolescents with emotional or behavioral difficulties; 3) psychiatric rehabilitation and vocational rehabilitation services for individuals with serious mental illness; and 4) day habilitation and vocational rehabilitation services for individuals with developmental disabilities.

The first phase of the project would involve renovating 2,300 square feet of open garage space under Way Station's recently-acquired building located at 228 West Patrick Street. This improved space would house client services and staff offices that would be moved from other buildings in order to accommodate the program growth noted above. The second phase of the project would involve replacing the entire HVAC system in Way Station's adjacent 30,000 sq. ft. building located at 230 West Patrick Street. The present HVAC system has aged to deterioration and the increasing malfunctions are creating health challenges for the vulnerable client population served in the building as well as incurring escalating maintenance costs. This improvement is another critical component of Way Station's ability to effectively accommodate the growth in the four client programs described above.

In addition to supporting these Maryland citizens in need, the project will also directly benefit the general public by providing additional off-street parking for residents of the surrounding neighborhood. While not funded with project cash, another ancillary component of the project is the development by Way Station of a 25-space parking lot on a nearby property. The City of Frederick has approved Way Station developing and using that lot to meet the off-street parking requirements for the renovations of the 228 West Patrick Street garage space. Way Station will permit residents of the surrounding neighborhood to park overnight in the lot, thereby helping to meet the parking needs of the larger community.
