FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 186 (Delegates Rosenberg and Niemann)

Environmental Matters Judicial Proceedings

Real Property - Assigns, Successors, Heirs, Legatees, and Personal Representatives

This bill specifies that the provision in the Real Property Article stating that an obligation imposed on or a right granted to a person automatically is binding on or inures to the benefit of specified persons unless otherwise expressly provided applies only to obligations and rights specified in the Real Property Article.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Restricting the application of this provision would not materially affect the overall caseload of the Judiciary.

Local Effect: None – see above.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal.

Analysis

Current Law: Unless otherwise expressly provided, an obligation imposed on or a right granted to a person automatically is binding on or inures to the benefit of the assigns, successors, heirs, legatees, and personal representatives of that person. The provision may not be construed to create or confer any rights of assignment where not would exist otherwise.
