6. Purpose of Bill

Grant to the Board of Directors of Addiction Recovery, Inc. for the repair, renovation, and capital equipping of Hope House, an alcohol and drug addiction residential treatment facility, located in Crownsville.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

Grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund of \$50,000. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. The fund may consist of in kind contributions.

10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Hope House services are operated under the governance of the nonprofit corporation, Addiction Recovery, Inc. (ARI) a private, nonprofit 501c3 organization that provides Detoxification, Short Term Inpatient Care, and Extended Care facility for the treatment of alcoholism and drug addiction. The program is dedicated to serving indigent and underinsured individuals who without our services, would not be able to obtain adequate treatment for their chemical dependency. Compared to 3.2 % unemployment in AnnArundel County, 96% of the patients admitted to Hope House in 2006 were unemployed.

Hope House is accredited by The Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitative Facilities (CARF) This national benchmarking system is designed to assist an organization in maintaining only the highest quality of standards. Hope House also maintains certification by the State of Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Office of Healthcare Quality.

We are governed by an 11 member board of directors. The authority to manage all aspects of the program flows from the ARI Board of Directors to the Executive Director.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The building that we operate from is 57 years old and is located on the grounds of Crownsille State Hospital. Since the closing of this state facility we have been required to provide maintenance and repairs to our facility without any compensation from the state or county. Building inspectors from the State Dept.of Health and Mental Hygiene along with the Maryland Dept.of Housing and Community Development unofficially stated to us last year that "the roof of the building needs immediate repairs". We approached the State to help with the repairs but they stated that they were not in a position to assist.

Additionally, due to the same circumstances of the closing of the State Hospital, we were informed on June 30th, 2006 that the electrical substation serving our facility would be taken out of service. This would require Hope House to have its own substation. Although the closing down of the states substation has not occurred to date it will be only a matter of time when it will be.
