#### 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Chimes was founded in 1947 to assist children who were excluded from public education to achieve the highest level of integration and function in their community today. In addition to that service, Chimes provides a broad array of services, including tradtional site-based day, vocational and residential services, non-traditional support based models, and fair market employment opportunities for persons with disabilities.

#### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The school is currently located at Andrews Hall on the Maryland School for the Blind. The facility is nearly 50 years old and in need of a major overhaul of structural systems. In addition the building is not barrier free, having few handicapped accessible bathrooms a second floor without elevator, and limited recreation and library facilities. The proposed new school addresses these issues as well as provides the opportunity for new innovative programs. In addition, by owning the building, Chimes will be able to cap the continued increase in rental costs.
