## **10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization** (3000 characters maximum)

Since its inception in 2002, the Sandi's Learning Center, Inc. program is grounded on wellestablished models for excellence. Serving children from six weeks to 12 years old, the Center currently serves 50 children and their families who reside in one of Baltimore City's communities most highly affected by urban blight and social toxins. The center is committed and dedicated to redeveloping a community while helping to educate it youngest children. We effectively stretch scarce financial resources; we provide care for under-served populations and we utilize methods of serving Maryland's working parents' needs for child care.

The most distinguishing feature is that our center operates like a preschool rather than a daycare facility. It utilizes one college-train instructor for every six children. The Center has created a learning environment that not only enhances the development of children, but also assists families in making children better citizens; offering family free services to parents, assisting them to rebuild themselves. Moreover, there is no cost for field trips for the children or parents and we provide healthy meals at no cost for children and parents (breakfast, am snack, lunch, and pm snack).

Sandi's Learning Center is the only child care center in the 21216 zip code that is accredited by Maryland State Department of Education. Sandi's Learning Center has partnered with several organizations: Baltimore City Child Care Resource Center Head Start, BCCCRC Early Intervention Project, the Family League, the Department of Social Services Family Investment Program, Baltimore Reads and Project S.E.R.V.E. (Service, Empowerment, Revitalization, Volunteerism, and Employment Training). Sandi's Learning Center received The 16th Annual Child Care Challenge Award sponsored by the Women Legislators of Maryland. We also received the Judith Hoyer Grant in 2005 and 2006. The center met the requirements for Tiered Reimbursement – Level Four.

In addition, Sandi's Learning Center has provided high quality training in areas identified by staff as needed for professional development and competencies in order to support teachers in maintaining or elevating levels of credentials in the state of Maryland. All employees are eligible to receive a benefit package that includes health benefits and dental, tuition reimbursement and vacation. Sandi's Learning Center employees are also provided compensation in the form of bonuses for commendable performance and/or commitment to professional development.

Sandi's Learning Center is active in the immediate neighborhood, schools, community associations, local businesses and agencies.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

A capital grant of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000.00) is requested to complete the construction of a 15,200 square foot early childhood facility at 1701 North Ellamont Street. This will enable Sandi's Learning Center, Inc. to provide a much-needed service to a community lacking in child development, family development, and community development services.

According to the Census 2000 Demographic Profile Highlights, the total population in the 21216 zip code is 36,242, with a median household income in 1999 dollars of \$26,946.00. The percentage of families living below poverty level in the area is 21.4 percent compared to 9.2 percent in the United States. Additionally, in 2005, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price lunch, an indicator of poverty, had an average score that was lower than that of students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price lunch by 33 points.

The total cost of the project for is \$2.2 million. As of today, we have raised \$1.6 million. In March 2006, we received a State Bond Bill sponsored by Senator Ralph Hughes, Delegate Marshall Goodwin, Delegate Salima Marriott and Delegate Cathy Pugh in the amount of \$300,000.00. In June 2006, we received a grant from Baltimore City Department of Housing and Community Development in the amount of \$200,000, we received a grant from The Abell Foundation in the amount \$150,000, and a grant from Maryland State Department of Housing and Community Development Neighborhood Business Works Program in the amount of \$50,000.00. In addition, we received a loan from 1st Mariner Bank in the amount of \$700,000 and Sandi's Learning Center has invested \$200,000. More over, our ground breaking ceremony was October 26, 2006.

The completion of the new building by December 2007 will enable Sandi's Learning Center to service a minimum of one hundred fifty-four children in the community. In early 2004, there were 14,412 children on a waiting list for child care assistance in Maryland. The facility will provide the necessary space to offer services to families through our partners, Baltimore City Child Care Resource Center, (BCCCRC), Family League, Baltimore Reads and Project S.E.R.V.E. (Service, Empowerment, Revitalization, Volunteerism, Employment Training).
