#### 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The Humane Society of Charles County started in 1978 with 25 members and has steadily increased to over 2,000 with services expanding as well. We have the dual mission of promoting the humane treatment of animals and of fostering a respect for all life, both animal and human, through educational programs. We have an active education department that provides programs for citizens from pre-K to seniors. Also, students are able to earn community service hours for high school graduation through our Jr. Volunteer program. We are also active in the community by providing weekly pet visits to area nursing homes and assisted-living facilities. The Humane Society also shelters, rehabilitates, and adopts rescued animals in our facility. Emergency medical care is provided to injured, ill stray or abandonded animals. We offer a low cost spay clinic to the public. Goals and objectives in 2007: (1) To begin construction of the addition to the facility (2) To complete renovations to our original 10-run dog holding area (3) To expand our low cost spay/neuter services to the pets of county residents, regardless of income (4) To offer additional rabies clinics in the southern and western sections of the county (5) To install a centralized computer system, allowing quick access to lost and found reports and tracking citizens releasing or adopting animals (6) Expand our Humane Environmental programs to reach large groups of students more effectively with a new projector system.

### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The Humane Society of Charles County is the only organization acting as an agent for the County to help shelter animals. No other non-profit agency in the County is equipped or available to provide these services. Additionally, we are the only organization doing high volume, low cost sterilization surgeries for dogs and cats which helps to control the animal over-population problem. Also, our Humane Education department reached over, 5,000 students in 2006. This demonstrates the magnitude of our educational presentations and the importance for continuing these efforts. We are the only non-profit agency that provides these educational opportunities of this magnitude free of charge to county residents.

Funds will be utilized toward the construction of a 1,600 sq. ft. addition to the facility. The addition will provide space for Community Service Activities: Humane Education presentations, Discovery Program, KIND Club, CSM Vet Tech classes, meeting room for 4-H Club and other community groups, Vaccine Clinics, Dog Obedience classes, student volunteer program, Humane Education office and storage space, Office for Volunteer Coordinator.

Also for Animal Sheltering Activities: Larger holding area for incoming cats, isolation area for sick cats, additional isolation dog runs, enlarged lobby area for shelter admission and adoptions, office space for manager and assistant manager.

Expansion of Low Cost Spay/Neuter Clinic will provide: Separate lobby entrance for clinic patients, separate recovery areas for dogs and cats, exam room for public vaccine clinic, dark room for x-ray processor.
