Grant to the Board of Directors of the Friends of Old Waldorf School Foundation, Inc. for the construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of the Old Waldorf School for use as a community center, located in Waldorf.

No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property. The fund may consist of in kind contributions or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act.

10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

The Friends of Old Waldorf School Foundation, Inc., (FOWS), founded in 1994, is a 501 (c)(3) non-profit charitable organization with an all-volunteer Board of Directors and a membership consisting of former alumni, concerned citizens and business leaders. Our mission is to preserve the historic old Waldorf School, the last remaining public building from the early days of Waldorf, as an historic landmark, and convert it into a multi-service community center for current and future generations to use and enjoy. We seek to document the history of the school and the town of Waldorf. Currently, FOWS' History Committee is researching, documenting and preserving important old documents, historical photos, and memorabilia from the early days of Waldorf for displays and reference, and it plans to produce a pamphlet on Waldorf's history for activities to commemorate Charles County's 350th Anniversary in 2008.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

The 1930 Historic old Waldorf School consists of five classrooms, an auditorium, stage, and a small office (approx. 7500 sf). Prior to our renovation efforts, the building was vacant for more than 16 years during which time it deteriorated substantially due to vandalism and neglect. Additional funds are needed to finish this project due to unknown factors that arose after cost projections were made and building construction had begun in 2001. The major unanticipated factor was the discovery of mold and bacteria that had to be removed from the interior walls at a cost of \$114,000.00 that required change orders to temporarily delete certain items from the construction project until additional funds could be raised. FOWS has renovated about 90% of the building and it is used as follows: Waldorf Head Start Center, approx. 75 students, 7 staff - four rooms (2572 sf), provides an early learning program for pre-K students from low/moderate income families and preand after-care services. Ballet Arts Academy (BAA), approx. 60 students, 2 staff - uses the backstage (862 sf) as its studio and shares space in the multi-service room (640 sf) for a lounge, provides training in the classical ballet arts. Auditorium (2519 sf) and stage (243 sf) - for use by various groups for performances, auditions, large meetings (capacity 340), and as overflow space for the Greater Waldorf Jaycee Foundation. Funds are needed to repaint and seal the building exterior, to install interior storm windows and insulate crawl spaces to reduce utility costs and complete the final phase of the project. At present, 75 % of FOWS' income is spent on utility costs and proceeds from our fund raisers were needed to supplement operating funds for the past two years. The final phase includes renovating the multi-service room (640 sf) by replacing the floor, upgrading HVAC, and installing a kitchenette for future catered events; and replacing the floor and adding heat to the Office (284 sf) that will be FOWS' official headquarters for operation, records maintenance, and management of the building.

The Greater Waldorf Jaycee Foundation is our good neighbor/friend and it leases the adjacent property from the County for its organization. The Jaycee Foundation has provided substantial support to FOWS' renovation project via in-kind services and labor over the past 6 years. After construction funds were expended in 2001, the Jaycees painted the interior of the building and refinished the floors in the auditorium and classrooms providing all materials and labor. In August 2005, the Jaycees removed and replaced the damaged portion of the backstage floor helping FOWS to renovate that space for a ballet studio for its new tenant, the Ballet Arts Academy at the Old Waldorf School. In 2006, the Jaycees sponsored a fund raising dinner/concert, and they have pledged their support for another major fundraiser in November 2007. FOWS completed the installation of a sidewalk and handicap ramp in 2005 at the front entrance which now allows the auditorium to be used and rented for performances and large gatherings or meetings, thereby providing funds to help offset utilities used for that area. The Waldorf Jaycees designated and striped the required number of parking spaces at the end of the handicap ramp and they continue to pledge their support for our project. FOWS has received support from numerous other business and community groups such as the Chaney Foundation, Lions Club, Home Depot, Zonta, and others over the years.
