#### 6. Purpose of Bill

Grant to the Board of Directors of Girl Scouts of Central Maryland, Inc. for the acquisition of building space to expand the Girl Scout Urban Program and Training Center.

#### 7. Matching Fund Requirements

Grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund of \$350,000. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of in kind contributions. The fund may consist of real property or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act.

## 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

Girl Scouts of Central Maryland (GSCM) is one of the ten largest Girl Scout Councils in the United States with a membership of 29,000 girls supported by 10,000 volunteers all residing in the state of Maryland. The council area encompasses Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Carroll, Howard, Harford, and Baltimore. Girl Scouts of Central Maryland operates from offices located in Baltimore City, Ellicott City and Aberdeen and is the only Girl Scout council headquartered in the state of Maryland. The Girl Scout program is the nation's premier leadership development program dedicated to the development of the full potential of girls and young women from all racial, ethnic, religious and socio-economic groups. In this informal educational program, girls are taught leadership and life skills to include goal setting, service to the community, antiviolence and drug education, healthy living and self-acceptance. We are proud of the fact that 16% of all girls in central Maryland, ages 5 through 17, are Girl Scouts. Nationally, only 9% of all girls are Girl Scouts. Girl Scouts of Central Maryland currently owns 28,000 square feet of space within the Baltimore City limits at the location of 4806 Seton Drive (at the corner of Liberty Avenue and Northern Parkway in the Seton Business Park). The space, purchased in 1996, is used to support the programs and trainings offered to our 29,000 girl and 10,000 adult members. In fiscal year 2006 Girl Scout programs were provided to 7,000 at-risk girls in Baltimore city through outreach initiatives delivered by paid staff. In addition to our outreach programs, Girl Scouts of Central Maryland provides programming to 2,100 Girl Scout troops.

#### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

An additional 6,700 square feet of space adjoining our current Service Center recently became available for purchase. Acquiring this additional space will allow Girl Scouts of Central Maryland to expand our programs offered to girls and increase our support services to the volunteers who work with the girls. The following projects will be made possible because of the acquisition of additional space:

- Exercise & Dance Studio for girls in the Baltimore region
- Technology Center to promote math, science and technology programs for girls in the Central Maryland region
- Volunteer Resource Center used for providing information and materials to the volunteers
- Multi-media Center used for training volunteers

In order to provide a quality Girl Scouting experience Girl Scouts of Central Maryland must provide support and ancillary services to the women and men who lead these Girl Scout troops. Trainings were provided to 8,000 volunteers in 2006 to better prepare them to work with the girls. Our urban office houses 60 employees, one very large multi-purpose room, a volunteer resource center, and a Girl Scout store that stocks uniforms, badges, patches and handbooks. Because Girl Scouts of Central Maryland has increased overall membership by 4,000 girls and adults since 1996 there is a need to acquire additional space in order to expand our programs to the girls and training and support to the volunteers.

With the additional space Girl Scouts of Central Maryland can house a technology center where girls can enhance their skills in math, science and technology—preparing them for careers in fields where women are traditionally under represented. Girl Scouts of Central Maryland will offer educational programming and activities to all 29,000 girls and 10,000 adult members. Nearly every girl and volunteer will benefit in one way or another from participation in programs and trainings offered in the Urban Program & Training Service Center.
