The Town of Easton is the grantee. Purpose of the memorial is twofold. One, to recognize deceased individuals for their service to Talbot County and our Nation. Two, to commemorate the site of the first municipally owned gas plant.				
11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)				
The project is a memorial to deceased military veterans, firefighters and police officers. It will also identify the site as one of the first municipally owned gas plants in the United States. The memorial will consist of a brick wall, thirty six feet long, topped by a black granite slab with the inscription "Gone But Not Forgotten". The centerpiece of the wall will be the gas plant cornerstone which was saved from the original building. Brass plaques will identify the cornerstone plus add some history. A plaque will also indicate the memorials purpose. Antique gas lanterns will anchor either end of the wall. Lastly, imprinted brick pavers will be placed honoring deceased military veterans, fire fighters and police officers.
