# Wicomico County - Alcoholic Beverages - Minimum Seating Capacity for Licensed Restaurants

This bill reduces the minimum seating capacity requirement from 75 to 40 persons for restaurants in Wicomico County with a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2007.

### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** Wicomico County revenues could increase by a minimum amount from the expansion of licensing eligibility. County expenditures would not be affected.

**Small Business Effect:** Potential revenue increase for small businesses meeting new eligibility guidelines.

## **Analysis**

**Current Law:** Restaurants holding a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license in Wicomico County are required to have a minimum seating capacity for 75 persons.

The annual license fee in Wicomico County for a restaurant with a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license in \$1,320.

**Background:** Establishments with seating capacity for fewer than 75 persons are currently eligible for a Class B beer and wine license. The annual license fee is \$400. Wicomico County assumes that several current holders of the Class B beer and wine license will apply for the Class B beer, wine, and liquor license if the proposed legislation is enacted, potentially increasing revenue by \$920 per licensee. As of April 30, 2006, there are 13 establishments holding a Class B beer and wine license in Wicomico County.

**Local Fiscal Effect:** It is likely that several current Class B beer and wine license holders would apply for a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license if the minimum seating capacity requirement is reduced. Wicomico County could realize \$920 in additional revenue from current license holders and \$1,320 from new applicants. Overall increases in revenue are expected to be minimal. It is assumed that any additional licensing activity could be accommodated with existing resources.
