Grant to the Board of Directors of the Baltimore Teacher Network, Inc. for the acquisition, construction, repair, renovation, and capital equipping of the ConneXions Community Leadership Academy.

#### 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

ConneXions Community Leadership Academy is a teacher-led Charter middle/high school with a strong focus on project-based learning as well as devolopment through the Arts. The school currently houses grades 6 through 9. We will add one grade per year until we reach grade 12. Students at ConneXions are exposed to a supportive environment with high academic standards. In an effort to devolop well rounded students, the environment is saturated with African dance and drumming, hip-hop dance, visual arts, martial arts, and foreign language, all provided by independent artists from the local community. Students are also exposed to travel opportunites through the goodwill and time contributions of staff and community members locally and in host cities and towns all over the east coast. Normal program funding is provided through the Charter school, per pupil funding formula. Additional programming is supported by staff that volunteer hours beyond their normal teaching duties as well as fundraising efforts initiated by staff, students, and the Parent Action Team.

The population served at ConneXions is almost completely African-American, lower income to working class, mostly from West Baltimore. There are no entrance requirements. Students are accepted based on a lottery conducted each spring. Current enrollment is approximately 160 (40 per class). The projected enrollment at full capacity is 280 students.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

ConneXions' current building is a modular unit located behind a large middle school. The approximate size of the building is 8,000 square feet. There are 9 classrooms, and 1.5 offices. Due to the lack of a cafeteria, students walk to Lemmel Middle School to get lunch and bring it back to the school to eat. Whole school meetings are held in the hallway. The performing arts classes are bussed each day to a separate facility (Sankofa Dance Theater) for the last 2.5 hours of the day.

Despite our efforts to tap into the BCPSS facilities restructuring process, we have been unable to find a space to grow into. We are unable to accept the incoming (2007-08) class of 6<sup>th</sup> graders at our current location. This will cause hardship for 40 families, especially those with siblings already at ConneXions. We are seeking financial support to find a suitable space in which to continue the vitally important educational programming provided by ConneXions. As our population nearly doubles, we desire at least twice the space we currently have, bringing the total square footage to between 16,000 and 20,000 square feet. This would provide us with more classroom space for students and the additional teachers required to teach them. We will hire approximately 10 new staff members in the next 3 years. The additional space will also provide prerformace/rehearsal space, science labs, and art studio space. Initial funds will be applied to the design portion of the overall project. We will be working with architects to help bring our vision to fruition.
