## Howard County - Alcoholic Beverages - Beer Tasting Ho. Co. 19-07

This bill authorizes Howard County to issue a beer and wine tasting license and repeals the authorization for a wine tasting license.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2007.

## Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.
Local Effect: Potential minimal increase in Howard County revenues. Expenditures would not be affected.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal.

## Analysis

Bill Summary: This bill authorizes Howard County to issue a beer and wine tasting (BWT) alcoholic beverages license, which allows for the on-premises consumption of beer or wine for tasting or sampling only. The current wine tasting license is repealed in favor of the new BWT license.

The holder of a BWT license in Howard County is authorized to serve up to one ounce of wine of a given brand, with a total limit of four ounces of all brands served to any person
in a single day. Alternately, the licensee is authorized to serve up to three ounces of beer of a given brand, with a total limit of eight ounces of all brands served to any person in a single day.

A BWT license may be issued to the holder of a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license or a Class A beer and wine license. The annual license fee is $\$ 100$ in addition to the fee of any other alcoholic beverages license.

Current Law: The Howard County Board of License Commissioners is authorized to issue a wine tasting license, which permits the on-premises tasting or sampling of wine containing not more than $14 \%$ alcohol by volume. The licensee is authorized to serve up to one ounce of a given brand, with a limit of four ounces served to any one person in a single day.

The license may be issued to holders of a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license or a Class A beer and wine license. The annual fee is $\$ 100$ in addition to the fee for any other alcoholic beverages license.

Background: As of April 30, 2006, Howard County has issued 1 Class A beer and wine license and 51 Class A beer, wine, and liquor licenses.

Local Fiscal Effect: Howard County could experience a minimal increase in revenue if additional establishments apply for the new tasting license. It is assumed that any additional licensing and enforcement activity could be handled with existing resources.
