Authorizing the creation of a State Debt to serve as a grant to the Board of Directors of The Southern Maryland Applied Research and Technology Consortium, Inc. for the planning, repair, renovation, and capital equipping of the SMARTCO's Computer Technology Learning Center.

## 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (3000 characters maximum)

SMARTCO is a local community-based all volunteer 501(c) 3 non-profit corporation. The organization is registered and certified in the State of Maryland. SMARTCO's principle goal is to refurbish used Automated Data Processing (ADP) equipment, mostly personal computers, computer peripherals and other electronic devices, and to provide them free of charge to public, private and parochial schools, and other eligible non-profit community service organizations. We accept equipment donations from government, corporate, and personal entities. The Technology Transfer Act of 1995 governs the distribution of government donations of ADP equipment.

SMARTCO has been engaged in computer refurbishment activities since 1995. Since our inception, we have issued over 10,000 personal computers and peripherals to eligible clients throughout the State of Maryland and to areas of need within the United States, such as the Gulf Coast following Hurricane Katrina. Recently the Microsoft/TechSoup consortia named SMARTCO as a Microsoft Authorized Refurbisher (MAR). The MAR certification allows SMARTCO to install current versions of the Microsoft operating systems, and provide the certificates of authenticity and enduser license agreements to our clients.

In addition to the computer-refurbishing program, SMARTCO continues to expand our Computer Technology Learning Center (CTLC) to train unemployed, under-employed, and under-served individuals, senior citizens, primary and secondary school teachers and students in basic computer literacy and computer refurbishment skills. SMARTCO has been offering basic computer literacy training since 2001. Over 120 students have completed the curriculum and have gone on to achieve some remarkable results. In February 2006, SMARTCO began a computer refurbishment program in partnership with the St. Mary's County Office on Aging. As of June 2006, 50 individuals have completed the program.

The success of our computer refurbishment program has led to the creation of a computer-recycling (e-cycling) program. We recycle 100% of non-operational or dated equipment that does not efficiently run the operating systems found in today's marketplace. Since beginning the program in June 2004, SMARTCO has recycled over 100 tons of computer equipment.

The growing local and regional need for the services provided by SMARTCO have made it necessary to expand our refurbishment activities, the CTLC, and to focus our efforts in the expansion of our recycling program. The growth of these programs requires SMARTCO to continue our search for additional sources of funding.

### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (3000 characters maximum)

This grant will be used to:

- Design, construct, and equip an Internet Café for use by the general public.
- Develop the process and procedures, and begin to equip a 100% Electronic Recycling (E-cycling) Program Model that can be expanded State-wide.

The financial support will enable SMARTCO to continue returning to the community much needed educational and computer equipment needed to assist the underprivileged, under employed, senior citizens, and others in "Bridging the Digital Divide" in this technology driven environment.
