## SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- (a) The Department of General Services shall collect data from all units of State government on the issue of property management by the units and shall study the benefits and disadvantages of the procurement of property management functions by each unit and the Department as opposed to the management of State real property by each unit.
- (b) On or before January 9, 2008, the Department of General Services shall issue a preliminary report of the findings of the study conducted under this section to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article.

  - SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
