 imposes certain limits on General Fund appropriations in the State Budget
 under certain circumstances; and submitting this amendment to the qualified
 voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses 15 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

18 EACH BUDGET SHALL EMBRACE (4)[Each] THE LIMITATIONS 19 PRESCRIBED UNDER SECTION 53 OF ARTICLE III OF THE CONSTITUTION. 20ADDITIONALLY, EACH Budget shall embrace an estimate of all appropriations in such form and detail as the Governor shall determine or as may be prescribed by law, 21as follows: (a) for the General Assembly as certified to the Governor in the manner 2223hereinafter provided; (b) for the Executive Department; (c) for the Judiciary 24Department, as provided by law, as certified to the Governor; (d) to pay and discharge 25the principal and interest of the debt of the State in conformity with Section 34 of

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1 Article III of the Constitution, and all laws enacted in pursuance thereof; (e) for the 2 salaries payable by the State and under the Constitution and laws of the State; (f) for 3 the establishment and maintenance throughout the State of a thorough and efficient 4 system of public schools in conformity with Article 8 of the Constitution and with the 5 laws of the State; and (g) for such other purposes as are set forth in the Constitution or 6 laws of the State.

8 (A) (1) **ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR BEGINNING IN** 9 CALENDAR YEAR 2008. THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES SHALL 10 A FORECAST THAT COMPARES ONGOING GENERAL FUND PREPARE 11 APPROPRIATIONS WITH ONGOING GENERAL FUND REVENUES FOR THE 12CURRENT FISCAL YEAR AND 5 SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEARS. ONGOING GENERAL 13FUND APPROPRIATIONS AND ONGOING GENERAL FUND REVENUES SHALL BE 14 DEFINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES.

15 (2) IF THE FORECAST FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR INDICATES
 THAT ONGOING GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS EXCEED ONGOING GENERAL
 FUND REVENUES BY MORE THAN 5% OF ONGOING GENERAL FUND REVENUES,
 THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES SHALL DECLARE A FORECASTED
 STRUCTURAL DEFICIT FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR.

(B) IF THE FORECAST GIVEN IN A CURRENT FISCAL YEAR INDICATES A
 FORECASTED STRUCTURAL DEFICIT FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR, THE BUDGET
 SUBMITTED BY THE GOVERNOR IN JANUARY FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR MUST
 LIMIT GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS SO THAT THE TOTAL GENERAL FUND
 APPROPRIATION FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR MAY NOT EXCEED THE CURRENT
 FISCAL YEAR GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS BY MORE THAN 3%.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 27 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act 28 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the 29 Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not 30 apply.

31SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section 32proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of this State at the next general election to be held in 33 November, 2008 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the 34Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment 35 to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the 36 37 words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional 38 Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as 39

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- 1 directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in
- 2 accordance with Article XIV.
