FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 35 Ways and Means (Delegate Olszewski, et al.)

Casino Gaming - Conditions and Restrictions

This bill provides that if legislation is enacted authorizing for-profit "casino gaming" (includes video lottery terminals), the designated State regulatory entity has to require all casino gaming to be conducted in no more than three stand-alone casinos at locations determined by the regulatory entity based on compatibility with the surrounding community. A license can only be issued to an applicant that engages in collective bargaining agreements with organized labor and submits an economic development plan for the area surrounding the casino. All casino employees must be paid at least the State's living wage.

Fiscal Summary
