## AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 140

(Third Reading File Bill)

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, strike "Criminal Procedure – Criminal Injuries Compensation Board" and substitute "Criminal Injuries Compensation"; in line 4, strike "requiring" and substitute "authorizing"; in line 5, strike "an" and substitute "a certain"; in line 8, after "circumstances;" insert "repealing a provision prohibiting a certain claimant from receiving an award unless the claimant proves a certain lack of knowledge;"; in line 13, after "applies;" insert "modifying certain definitions; providing that certain limitations regarding eligibility for an award do not apply with respect to certain victims;"; and in line 17, strike "11-810" and substitute "11-801, 11-808(a), 11-810(a) and (d),".

# AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, after line 1, insert:

### "11–801.

- (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (b) "Board" means the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board.
- (c) "Claimant" means the person filing a claim under this subtitle.
- (d) (1) "Crime" means:
- (i) except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a criminal offense under state, federal, or common law that is committed in:

- 1. this State; or
- <u>2.</u> another state against a resident of this State; or
- (ii) an act of international terrorism as defined in Title 18, § 2331 of the United States Code that is committed outside of the United States against a resident of this State.
- (2) "Crime" does not include an act involving the operation of a vessel or motor vehicle unless the act is:
- (I) A VIOLATION OF TITLE 2, SUBTITLE 5, § 2-209, § 3-204, OR § 3-211 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;
- (II) A VIOLATION OF § 8-738 OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES
  ARTICLE;
- [(i)] (III) a violation of § 20–102, § 20–104, § 21–902, or § 21–904 of the Transportation Article; or
- [(ii)] (IV) operating a motor vehicle or vessel that results in an intentional injury.
  - (e) "Dependent" means:
    - (1) <u>a surviving spouse or child of a person; or</u>
    - (2) a person who is dependent on another person for principal support.
  - (f) "Victim" means a person:

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- (1) who suffers physical injury or death as a result of a crime or delinquent act;
  - (2) who suffers psychological injury as a direct result of:
- (i) [a fourth degree sexual offense or a delinquent act that would be a fourth degree sexual offense if committed by an adult;
- (ii)] a [felony] CRIME or a delinquent act that would be a [felony] CRIME if committed by an adult; or
- [(iii)] (II) physical injury or death directly resulting from a crime or delinquent act; [or]
  - (3) who suffers physical injury or death as a direct result of:
- (i) trying to prevent a crime or delinquent act or an attempted crime or delinquent act from occurring in the person's presence;
- (ii) trying to apprehend an offender who had committed a crime or delinquent act in the person's presence or had committed a felony or a delinquent act that would be a felony if committed by an adult; or
- (iii) <u>helping a law enforcement officer in the performance of the officer's duties or helping a member of a fire department who is being obstructed from performing the member's duties; OR</u>
- (4) WHO IS A VICTIM OF TRAFFICKING AS DEFINED UNDER 22 U.S.C. § 7102 OR WHO WAS OTHERWISE FORCED TO PARTICIPATE IN A CRIME OR DELINQUENT ACT.

11–808.

- (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the following persons are eligible for awards in the manner provided under this subtitle:
  - (i) a victim;
  - (ii) a dependent of a victim who died as a direct result of:
    - 1. a crime or delinquent act;
- 2. trying to prevent a crime or delinquent act or an attempted crime or delinquent act from occurring in the victim's presence or trying to apprehend a person who had committed a crime or delinquent act in the victim's presence or had committed a felony or a delinquent act that would be considered a felony if committed by an adult; or
- 3. <u>helping a law enforcement officer perform the officer's</u> duties or helping a member of a fire department who is obstructed from performing the member's duties;
- (iii) any person who paid or assumed responsibility for the funeral expenses of a victim who died as a direct result of:
  - <u>1.</u> <u>a crime or delinquent act;</u>
- 2. trying to prevent a crime or delinquent act or an attempted crime or delinquent act from occurring in the victim's presence or trying to apprehend a person who had committed a crime or delinquent act in the victim's presence or had committed a felony; or

- 3. <u>helping a law enforcement officer perform the officer's</u> duties or helping a member of a fire department who is obstructed from performing the member's duties; and
- (iv) 1. a parent, child, or spouse of a victim who resides with the victim; or
- <u>2.</u> <u>a parent, child, or spouse of an individual who is incarcerated for abuse as defined in § 4–501 of the Family Law Article and who, prior to incarceration:</u>
  - A. resided with the parent, child, or spouse; and
- B. provided financial support to the parent, child, or spouse.
- (2) A person who commits the crime or delinquent act that is the basis of a claim, or an accomplice of the person, OTHER THAN A VICTIM DESCRIBED IN § 11-801(F)(4) OF THIS SUBTITLE, is not eligible to receive an award with respect to the claim.";

and in line 9, after "(iii)" insert "EXCEPT IN THE CASE OF A VICTIM DESCRIBED IN § 11-801(F)(4) OF THIS SUBTITLE,".

On pages 2 and 3, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 17 on page 2 through line 2 on page 3, inclusive.

On page 3, in line 3, strike "(1)"; in line 6, strike "SHALL" and substitute "MAY"; in lines 9 and 12, strike "(I)" and "(II)", respectively, and substitute "(1)" and "(2)", respectively; in line 11, strike "OR"; in line 14, after "CLAIM" insert "; OR

(3) THE VICTIM WAS AN OCCUPANT OF A MOTOR VEHICLE OR A DEPENDENT OF AN OCCUPANT OF A MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATED IN VIOLATION OF § 21-902 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE, AND THE OCCUPANT KNEW OR SHOULD HAVE KNOWN OF THE CONDITION OF THE OPERATOR OF THE VEHICLE";

and in lines 25 and 31, in each instance, strike the bracket.

On page 4, strike in their entirety lines 3 through 11, inclusive; in line 14, after "the" insert "**EFFECTIVE**"; and strike beginning with the comma in line 14 through the comma in line 16.
