BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13 Chapter 523 of the Acts of 2007 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That: 15 There is a Task Force to Study the Boating Industry in Maryland. 16 (a) 17 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

- 1 One member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the (1) 2 President of the Senate: 3 One member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker (2)4 of the House; 5 (3)The Secretary of Natural Resources, or the Secretary's designee: 6 (4)The Secretary of Business and Economic Development, or the 7 Secretary's designee: The Secretary of the Environment, or the Secretary's designee; and 8 (5)9 The following members, appointed by the Governor: (6) 10 (i) Two representatives from the Marine Trade Association of 11 Maryland; 12 (ii) Two representatives from local tourism boards or visitor bureaus that are from counties that border the Chesapeake Bay; 13 14 (iii) One representative from a local yacht club; 15 (iv) One owner and operator of a marina in the State; 16 One owner or operator of a boat dealership in the State; and (\mathbf{v}) 17 (vi) One representative from the Maryland Tourism Council. 18 The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates jointly shall designate the chair of the Task Force. 19 20 (b) The Task Force may establish subcommittees as it determines necessary 21to fulfill its duties. 22 The Department of Business and Economic Development and the Department of Natural Resources shall provide staff for the Task Force. 23 24A member of the Task Force may not receive compensation for serving as a member of the Task Force but is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the 2526 Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

- 28 (1) Evaluate and make recommendations regarding growing the 29 boating industry within the State, including:

$rac{1}{2}$	(i) Evaluating incentives to encourage large boats and yachts to use marinas and boatyards for recreation, repair, and outfitting within the State;
$\frac{3}{4}$	(ii) Determining ways to encourage and promote tourism throughout waters of the State;
5 6	(iii) Researching the economic impact that marine industries and recreational boaters contribute to the State's economy; and
7 8 9	(iv) Identifying barriers that limit the State's competitiveness with other states regarding the boating industry and developing methods to overcome these barriers; and
10 11 12 13	(2) (i) On or before November 30, 2007, submit a preliminary report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Economic Matters Committee; and
14 15 16	(ii) On or before [June 30] DECEMBER 31 , 2008, submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly.
17 18 19 20	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of [1 year and 1 month] 2 YEARS and, at the end of [July 31, 2008] JUNE 30, 2009 , with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
