3 4 5 6 7 8	FOR the purpose of altering the number of winery special event permits that the Comptroller may issue in a calendar year to a licensed Class 4 Maryland limited winery in St. Mary's County; altering the number of permits a limited winery in the county may use in the same political subdivision; and generally relating to winery special event permits issued to Class 4 Maryland limited wineries in St. Mary's County.
9 10 11 12 13	BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages Section 2–101(u) Annotated Code of Maryland (2005 Replacement Volume and 2007 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 19 20	(u) (1) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (5) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE Office of the Comptroller may issue a winery special event permit to a licensed Class 4 Maryland limited winery, provided that:
$\begin{array}{c} 21 \\ 22 \end{array}$	(i) No more than 12 winery special event permits are issued to the Class 4 Maryland limited winery in any given calendar year;
23	(ii) The permit does not exceed 3 consecutive days; and



$1 \\ 2 \\ 3$	(iii) No more than three winery special event permits are issued in any calendar year to any given limited winery for use in the same political subdivision.
4 5	(2) The winery special event permit may only be issued for an event which:
6 7 8	(i) Has as its major purpose an activity other than the sale and promotion of alcoholic beverages and for which the participation of the winery is a subordinate activity;
9 10	(ii) Is approved by the Department of Agriculture and the Office of the Comptroller; and
11 12	(iii) Is held on a nonlicensed premises or a premises on which a person may obtain a temporary alcoholic beverages license.
13	(3) A winery special event permit shall authorize the holder to:
14 15	(i) Provide samples not to exceed 1 fluid ounce per brand to consumers;
16 17	(ii) Sell not more than four 750 ml bottles of wine to a consumer at any given event or festival for off–premises consumption; and
18 19	(iii) Sell by the glass wine produced by the licensee to persons participating in any event or festival and for on-premises consumption.
20 21	(4) The winery special event permit application shall be filed with the Office of the Comptroller not less than 15 days prior to any event.
22 23 24 25	(5) In a calendar year, the Office of the Comptroller may issue to a Class 4 Maryland limited winery in St. Mary's County not more than 18 winery special event permits, of which not more than five may be used in the same political subdivision.
26 27	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
