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Home Financial Accountability Act of 2008

- FOR the purpose of clarifying the availability of certain books and records kept by or 3 on behalf of certain common ownership communities for certain purposes and to 4 5 certain persons; requiring the governing body of certain common ownership 6 communities, on request of a member, unit owner, or lot owner, to compile and mail send certain information within a certain time; making a stylistic change; 7 8 altering certain limitations concerning public inspection of certain records; 9 prohibiting certain common ownership communities from imposing certain fees other than a reasonable charge imposed on a person desiring to review or copy 10 certain books and records or who requests delivery of certain information; 11 providing that a charge for copying certain records may not exceed a certain 12 amount; and generally relating to access to the books and records of cooperative 13 14 housing associations, condominiums, and homeowners associations.
