## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## **Human Trafficking - Services for Victims**

3 FOR the purpose of providing services for victims of human trafficking; requiring the names and identifying information of victims of human trafficking and their 4 5 families to be kept confidential; requiring certain persons to keep a victim informed of the victim's legal rights and the progress of certain proceedings; 6 7 requiring certain efforts to be made to provide protection to victims of human 8 trafficking and their families; requiring the State's Attorney to ensure that the victim and the victim's family are provided with certain relocation services 9 under certain circumstances; requiring the Department of Human Resources to 10 establish certain support services programs for victims of human trafficking; 11 establishing certain requirements for the programs; authorizing the 12 13 Department of Human Resources to enter into certain contracts; requiring that each victim be provided with a certain caseworker for certain purposes; 14 establishing that communication between a victim and a caseworker is 15 confidential; requiring that money for certain support services programs be as 16 provided in the State budget and be used to supplement certain other money; 17 requiring the Secretary of Human Resources to include a report on certain 18 support services programs in a certain annual report; authorizing certain 19 programs to include certain services; establishing certain requirements for 20 21 victims who are provided certain shelter; and generally relating to services for 22 victims of human trafficking.
