AN ACT concerning		
Fallen Sol	ldier Privacy Act of 2	2008

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from <u>knowingly</u> using the name, portrait,
picture, or image of a certain deceased soldier for certain purposes without prior
consent from certain individuals; <u>providing for the application of this Act</u>;
defining a certain term; establishing a certain penalty; and generally relating to
the use of a deceased soldier's identity.
