CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Furnishing an Alcoholic Beverage to Underage Individual – Penalty**

3 FOR the purpose of making it a misdemeanor for a person knowingly and willfully to
4 furnish an alcoholic beverage for consumption to an individual under the age of
5 21 years under certain circumstances; imposing a certain criminal penalty;
6 repealing certain provisions requiring the issuance of a civil citation to a person
7 who violates the prohibition against furnishing an alcoholic beverage for
8 consumption to an underage individual; clarifying the elements of a certain
9 alcoholic beverage violation; and generally relating to penalties for furnishing
10 an alcoholic beverage to an underage individual.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person may not
4 **KNOWINGLY AND WILLFULLY** furnish an alcoholic beverage to an individual [if:5 (1) the person furnishing the alcoholic beverage knows that the
6 individual is under the age of 21 years; and7 (2) the alcoholic beverage is furnished for the purpose of consumption
8 by the individual under the age of 21 years] **UNDER THE AGE OF 21 YEARS FOR THE**
9 **PURPOSE OF CONSUMPTION BY THE INDIVIDUAL UNDER THE AGE OF 21 YEARS.**10 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, an adult may not
11 knowingly and willfully allow an individual under the age of 21 years actually to
12 possess or consume an alcoholic beverage at a residence, or within the curtilage of a
13 residence that the adult owns or leases and in which the adult resides.14 (c) (1) The prohibition set forth in subsection (a) of this section does not
15 apply if the person furnishing the alcoholic beverage and the individual to whom the
16 alcoholic beverage is furnished:17 (i) are members of the same immediate family, and the
18 alcoholic beverage is furnished and consumed in a private residence or within the
19 curtilage of the residence; or

20 (ii) are participants in a religious ceremony.

21 (2) The prohibition set forth in subsection (b) of this section does not
22 apply if the adult allowing the possession or consumption of the alcoholic beverage and
23 the individual under the age of 21 years who possesses or consumes the alcoholic
24 beverage:25 (i) are members of the same immediate family, and the
26 alcoholic beverage is possessed and consumed in a private residence, or within the
27 curtilage of the residence, of the adult; or

28 (ii) are participants in a religious ceremony.

29 **(3) THE PROHIBITIONS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (B)**
30 **OF THIS SECTION DO NOT APPLY TO A PERSON WHO:**31 **(I) WAS ACTING IN THE CAPACITY OF A LICENSEE, OR AN**
32 **EMPLOYEE OF A LICENSEE, UNDER ARTICLE 2B OF THE CODE; AND**

1 **(II) HAS COMMITTED A VIOLATION OF AND IS SUBJECT TO**
2 **THE PENALTIES UNDER ARTICLE 2B, § 12-108 OF THE CODE.**

3 **(D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A**
4 **MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT**
5 **EXCEEDING 60 DAYS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR BOTH.**

7 (a) A person who violates [§§ 10-113 through 10-118] **§ 10-113, § 10-114,**
8 **§ 10-115, § 10-116, OR § 10-118** of this part shall be issued a citation under this
9 section.

10 (b) A citation for a violation of [§§ 10-113 through 10-118] **§ 10-113,**
11 **§ 10-114, § 10-115, § 10-116, OR § 10-118** of this part may be issued by:

12 (1) a police officer authorized to make arrests;

13 (2) in State forestry reservations, State parks, historic monuments,
14 and recreation areas, a forest or park warden under § 5-206(a) or (b) of the Natural
15 Resources Article; and

16 (3) in Anne Arundel County, Frederick County, Harford County,
17 Montgomery County, and Prince George's County, and only in the inspector's
18 jurisdiction, an alcoholic beverages inspector who investigates license violations under
19 Article 2B of the Code if the inspector:

20 (i) has successfully completed an appropriate program of
21 training in the proper use of arrest authority and pertinent police procedures as
22 required by the board of license commissioners; and

23 (ii) does not carry firearms in the performance of the inspector's
24 duties.

25 (f) (1) For purposes of this section, a violation of [§§ 10-113 through
26 10-118] **§ 10-113, § 10-114, § 10-115, § 10-116, OR § 10-118** of this part is a Code
27 violation and is a civil offense.

28 (h) (1) [Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, if] **IF** the
29 District Court finds that a person has committed a Code violation, the court shall
30 require the person to pay:

31 (i) a fine not exceeding \$500; or

32 (ii) if the violation is a subsequent violation, a fine not
33 exceeding \$1,000.

1 [(2) If the District Court finds that a person has committed a Code
2 violation under § 10–117 of this subtitle, the court shall require the person to pay:

3 (i) a fine not exceeding \$1,000; or

4 (ii) if the violation is a subsequent violation, a fine not
5 exceeding \$1,500.]

6 [(3)] (2) The Chief Judge of the District Court may not establish a
7 schedule for the prepayment of fines.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2008.
