- 1 AN ACT concerning
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Education – Reporting Requirement – Class Size

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to develop a uniform 4 data collection method to track a certain number of certain students in a certain 5 teacher's class; requiring a certain data collection method to reflect a certain 6 number of certain students in a certain class as of a certain date; requiring each 7 county board of education to implement a certain data collection method and 8 report the results of this data collection to the Department on or before a certain 9 date; requiring the Department to report to the General Assembly regarding certain data on or before a certain date; defining a certain term; and generally 10 relating to a uniform data collection method to determine the number of 11 students who participate in a classroom teacher's class. 12

11(2)REPORT THE RESULTS OF THE DATA COLLECTION TO THE12DEPARTMENT ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR.

(D) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT
SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246
OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE DATA OBTAINED UNDER
SUBSECTION (C)(2) OF THIS SECTION.
