3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to develop a uniform 4 data collection method to track a certain number of certain students in a certain 5 teacher's class by the beginning of a certain academic year; requiring a certain 6 data collection method to reflect a certain number of certain students in a 7 certain class as of a certain date; requiring each county board of education to 8 implement a certain data collection method and report the results of this data 9 collection to the Department on or before a certain date; requiring the Department to report to the General Assembly regarding certain data on or 10 before a certain date; defining a certain term; and generally relating to a 11 uniform data collection method to determine the number of students who 12 13 participate in a classroom teacher's class.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
