17 18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 22	(A) IN THIS SECTION, "BULLYING" MEANS ANY INTENTIONAL WRITTEN, VERBAL, OR PHYSICAL ACT, INCLUDING ANY PUBLISHED COMMUNICATION.

THAT HAS THE EFFECT OF:

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1	(1) PHYSICALLY HARMING AN INDIVIDUAL;
2	(2) DAMAGING AN INDIVIDUAL'S PROPERTY;
3	(3) Substantially interfering with an individual's
4	EDUCATION OR LEARNING ENVIRONMENT;
5	(4) PLACING AN INDIVIDUAL IN REASONABLE FEAR OF HARM TO
6	THE INDIVIDUAL'S PERSON OR PROPERTY; OR

9	(B) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A POLICY PROHIBITING

26	(D) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH LOCAL STANDARDS FOR
27	INVESTIGATING COMPLAINTS OF BULLYING AND DISCIPLINING INDIVIDUALS
28	WHO HAVE VIOLATED THE BULLYING POLICY THAT ARE BASED ON THE MODEL
29	UNIFORM STANDARDS DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.
30	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
31	July 1, 2008.
