2 **Criminal Injuries Compensation Board – Criminal Offense Outside of the**
3 **United States**

4 FOR the purpose of altering a certain definition to include criminal offenses committed
5 outside of the United States for the purpose of claims to the Criminal Injuries
6 Compensation Board; and generally relating to the Criminal Injuries
7 Compensation Board and criminal offenses outside of the United States.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Criminal Procedure**

16 11–801.

17 (d) (1) “Crime” means:

18 (i) except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a
19 criminal offense under state, federal, or common law that is committed in:

3 **3. ANOTHER COUNTRY OR TERRITORY OUTSIDE OF**
 4 **THE UNITED STATES AGAINST A RESIDENT OF THIS STATE; OR**

5 (ii) an act of international terrorism as defined in Title 18, §
 6 2331 of the United States Code that is committed outside of the United States against
 7 a resident of this State.

8 (2) “Crime” does not include an act involving the operation of a vessel
 9 or motor vehicle unless the act is:

10 (i) a violation of § 20–102, § 20–104, § 21–902, or § 21–904 of
 11 the Transportation Article; or

12 (ii) operating a motor vehicle or vessel that results in an
 13 intentional injury.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 15 October 1, 2008.
