## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Vehicle Laws - Proof of Legal Presence Act of 2008

3 FOR the purpose of adding the presentation of certain documentation certifying that 4 an individual born on or after a certain date is either a United States citizen or 5 is lawfully present in the United States in accordance with federal law to the 6 requirements for the issuance of an identification card or a moped operator's 7 permit; prohibiting the Motor Vehicle Administration from issuing a driver's 8 license to an individual born on or after a certain date who cannot provide 9 certain documentation certifying that the individual is either a United States citizen or is lawfully present in the United States in accordance with federal 10 11 law; prohibiting the Administration from issuing to a certain individual an 12 identification card, driver's license, or moped operator's permit that has certain 13 effective terms; providing that certain provisions relating to the issuance and expiration of a driver's license, moped operator's permit, or identification card 14 15 apply to any individual on or after a certain date; making certain technical corrections; and generally relating to individuals who are not lawfully present 16 17 in the United States and the issuance of driver's licenses, moped operator's 18 permits, and identification cards.

- 6 (a) On application, the Administration shall issue a moped operator's permit 7 to an individual:
- 8 (1) [who] WHO is 16 years of age or [older, and who] OLDER;
- 9 **(2) WHO** does not possess a valid driver's license issued by this State 10 or any other jurisdiction, but whose license or privilege to drive is not revoked, 11 suspended, refused, or canceled; **AND**
- 12 (3) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (G) OF THIS SECTION, WHO, IF THE
  13 INDIVIDUAL WAS BORN ON OR AFTER DECEMBER 1, 1964, IS EITHER A UNITED

- 26 (c) Each application for a moped operator's permit shall be on a form and contain the information that the Administration requires and each permit issued shall be of a size, design, and content that the Administration specifies.
- 29 (d) (1) A permit is not valid unless the applicant signs the applicant's 30 name on it in the applicant's usual signature.
- 31 (2) When issued and signed, a moped operator's permit only 32 authorizes its holder to operate a moped, as defined in § 11–134.1 of this article or a 33 motor scooter, as defined in § 11–134.5 of this article.

  25 after the driver's 21st birthday.
- 26 (3) A license is renewable on the presentation of an application, the payment of the renewal fee required by § 16–111.1 of this subtitle, and satisfactory completion of the examination required or authorized by subsection (h) of this section:
- 29 (i) Within 6 months before its expiration; or
- 30 (ii) When a driver qualifies for a corrected license issued under § 31 16–114.1(c) of this subtitle.
