13	Preamble
14 15	WHEREAS, Hepatitis C is a viral disease that attacks the liver and can cause lifelong infection, cirrhosis of the liver, cancer, liver failure, and death; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that there are an estimated 3,900,000 people in the United States who are infected with the hepatitis C virus; and
19 20	WHEREAS, It is estimated that 8,000 to 10,000 people die each year from chronic liver disease caused by hepatitis C; and
21 22 23	WHEREAS, The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services advises that approximately 12% of the 1,250 inmates enrolled in chronic care units in Maryland have tested positive for hepatitis C; and



1	WHEREAS, Chronic hepatitis C can be treated with antiviral medications, with
2	success rates of 30–40%; now, therefore,

- 3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
 - Article Correctional Services

- ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, SHALL REPORT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND ENVIRONMENTAL
- 11 AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE HEALTH AND GOVERNMENT
- 12 OPERATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON:
- 13 (1) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF 14 THE DEPARTMENT WHO HAVE BEEN TESTED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR 15 HEPATITIS C; AND
- 16 (2) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE TESTED POSITIVE FOR HEPATITIS C WHO HAVE RECEIVED TREATMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT.
